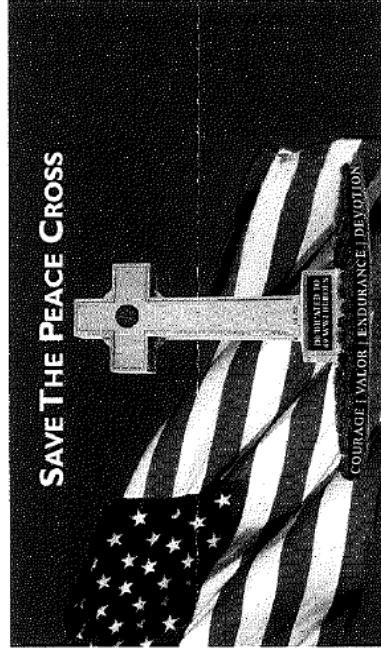

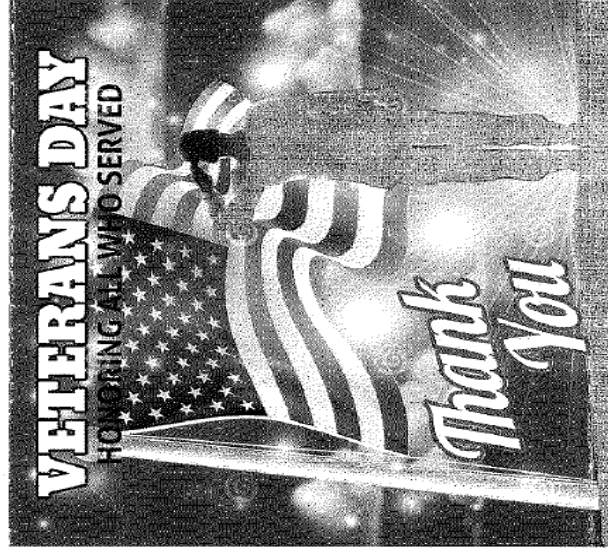

SERVICE AREA: An approximate five (5) mile air radius from each Town's Municipal Center/Town Hall.

OTHER INFORMATION: Physically and/or mentally challenged residents must be able to assist themselves or provide an escort. The driver is not permitted to assist any individuals. The services will be available at no charge for scheduled senior citizen meetings. If you have any questions regarding this service, please call the Colmar Manor Hall (301-277-4920).

Celebrating Hispanic Heritage



On October 12, nearly 60 Cottage City and Port Towns residents participated in the 3rd Annual Hispanic Heritage Month Celebration. This year we visited the National Museum of American History which held several Latino-focused activities, such as explanations of Dia de los Muertos, a DJ playing the golden era of Latino music like Boogaloo, Mambo and Salsa, and a cooking class with Peruvian Chef Daniela Hurtado who taught us how to make three signature dishes, lomo saltado, papas a la huancaína and chicha morada—all of which smelled and looked delicious!

In addition to the museums's featured events, we also had the opportunity to view the U.S flag that was raised to celebrate the victory over British forces during the War of 1812. It was the flag that inspired Francis Scott Key to write a song that eventually became the U.S. national anthem. Thanks to Kirk Kramer's history lesson of the War of 1812, we can take pride in knowing that our town played a pivotal role in the war and events that led to the creation of the anthem.

Special thanks to Cottage City residents, Ms. Gladys and Ms. Carolina who made and donated Salvadoran pupusas and tamales which we enjoyed before heading to the museum; and to Abel Nunez who shared important tips throughout the day including, why we celebrate Hispanic Heritage Month, how it was started, the difference between Hispanic and Latino, and why Salvadorans make up the largest Latino community in the DMV. Thanks also to the Town of Cottage City and Port Town Community Development Corporation for sponsoring the event and making it possible for residents from Colmar Manor and Bladensburg to join. We hope more families can join us next year!



Celebrando la Herencia Hispana



El 12 de octubre, casi 60 residentes de Cottage City y Port Towns participaron en la tercera celebración anual del Mes de la Herencia Hispana. Este año visitamos el Museo Nacional de Historia Estadounidense, que realizó varias actividades centradas en los Latinos, como explicaciones de Día de los Muertos, un DJ tocando música Latina de la era dorada como Boogaloo, Mambo y Salsa, y una clase de cocina con la Chef Peruana, Daniela Hurtado, quien nos enseñó cómo hacer lomo saltado, papas a la huancaína y chicha morada. ¡Todo olía y se veía delicioso!

Además de los eventos destacados del museo, también tuvimos la oportunidad de ver la bandera estadounidense que se levantó para celebrar la victoria sobre las fuerzas británicas durante la Guerra de 1812. Fue la bandera que inspiró a Francis Scott Key a escribir una canción que finalmente se convirtió en el himno nacional de los Estados Unidos. Gracias a la lección de historia de Kirk Kramer de la Guerra de 1812, podemos ser orgullosos de saber que nuestra ciudad desempeñó un papel fundamental en la guerra y los eventos que llevaron a la creación del himno.

Un agradecimiento especial a los residentes de Cottage City, la Sra. Gladys y la Sra. Carolina que hicieron y donaron pupusas y tamales salvadoreños que disfrutamos antes de ir al museo; y a Abel Núñez, quien compartió consejos importantes durante el día, incluyendo por qué celebramos el Mes de la Herencia Hispana, cómo se inició, la diferencia entre Hispanos y Latinos, y por qué los Salvadoreños constituyen la comunidad latina más grande en la área de Washington, DC. Gracias también a Town of Cottage City y Port Town Community Development Corporation por patrocinar el evento y hacer posible que los residentes de Colmar Manor y Bladensburg se unen a la celebración. ¡Esperamos que más familias puedan participar el próximo año!

It was the first time for most of us to attend the 11th Annual American Indian Festival (also called a "Pow Wow"), held at Patuxent River Park in Upper Marlboro, Md. The interest was high--some of the bus riders revealed their Indian heritage. And what a superb and novel experience it was! The day was spectacular--a perfect Indian Summer Day enhanced by the glorious colors of the fall foliage!

It began with a very informative talk on the 45 min bus ride by our very own Mr. David Proctor of Cottage City, a member of the Piscataway Tribal Nation. This group can be found in Southern MD, Baltimore, PG County & Washington DC. Piscataway means: "Place Where Waters Meet." (Note: Indians found in our area were called "Anacostans." Those Indians who migrated travelled thru North America to Central and South America.) Dressed in full regalia, Mr. Proctor delivered a short history of his people, giving a tribal overview and description of the historical territory that included the 15 sub-tribes of the Piscataway Confederacy. In our area, most of the villages were located near rivers where edible rice, roots, fish, planted crops, and local small animals were hunted and consumed. Mr. Proctor described a longhouse or dwelling and a typical village, among other things. Many questions were asked. A most interesting takeaway was a description of the significance of the tribal attire: each feather, ribbon, tassel or bead symbolically represented your life's work and accomplishments-- much like medals of honor. His baby son was also bedecked! Sponsored by the Natural & Historical Division of the Md. National Park & Planning Commission, the festival was very well attended. Upon arrival, we were anxious to taste the food. Once we got thru the very long lines, we ate such traditional favorites as fry bread, pumpkin bread, buffalo burgers, rez dogs & meat pies, dumpling, and pumpkin & apple pie. The snacks were quite tasty and affordable and everyone seemed anxious to sample! We saw singers, dancers & drummers and heard traditional & contemporary musical performances. Drum circles were formed and many of the attendees joined in. The Indian artisans were out selling arts & crafts, beautiful blankets, woven goods, baskets, jewelry, etc. The air was quite convivial and enjoyable, and a fun and safe trip was had by all! Thank you Cottage City Commission, for authorizing a wonderful day of "edutainment." We look forward to similar future endeavors involving the "First Peoples" of our Nation!

Note: During the bus talk, Mr. Proctor did a "Show & Tell" whereby he passed out several traditional Indian artifacts for closer scrutiny, such as beadwork, arrowheads and black osidian stone, deer hoof rattles, and a small pelt of beaver fur. He also played a Native American flute made of red cedar wood adorned by a carved eagle head. The sound was both haunting and mesmerizing, while at the same time mellowing.

Presentado por la Sra. Shirley Lewis, residente de Cottage City y organizadora de viajes

Era la primera vez que la mayoría de nosotros asistíamos al 11º Festival Anual de los Indios Americanos (también llamado "Pow Wow"), que se celebró en Patuxent River Park en Upper Marlboro, Maryland. El interés era alto: algunos de los pasajeros del autobús revelaron su herencia india ¡Y qué experiencia tan excelente y novedosa fue! El día fue espectacular: ¡un perfecto día de verano indio realizado por los gloriosos colores del follaje de otoño!

Comenzó con una charla muy informativa sobre el viaje en autobús de 45 minutos por nuestro propio Sr. David Proctor de Cottage City, miembro de la Nación Tribal Piscataway. Este grupo se puede encontrar en Southern Md, Baltimore, PG County y Washington DC. Piscataway significa: "Lugar donde las aguas se encuentran". (Nota: los indios encontrados en nuestra área se llamaban "anacostanos". Aquellos indios que emigraron viajaron a través de América del Norte a América Central y del Sur). Vestido con todo el atuendo, el Sr. Proctor presentó una breve historia de su pueblo, dando una descripción tribal y una descripción del territorio histórico que incluía las 15 sub-tribus de la Confederación Piscataway. En nuestra área, la mayoría de las aldeas estaban ubicadas cerca de ríos donde se cazaba y consumía arroz comestible, raíces, peces, cultivos plantados y pequeños animales locales. El Sr. Proctor describió una casa larga o vivienda y un pueblo típico, entre otras cosas. Se hicieron muchas preguntas. Lo más interesante fue una descripción de la importancia del atuendo tribal: cada pluma, cinta, borla o cuenta representaba simbólicamente el trabajo y los logros de su vida, al igual que las medallas de honor. ¡Su bebé también fue engañado! Patrocinado por la División Natural e Histórica de la Comisión de Planificación y Parques Nacionales de Maryland, el festival fue muy concurrido. Al llegar, estábamos ansiosos por probar la comida. Una vez que pasamos por las largas colas, comimos los favoritos tradicionales como pan frito, pan de calabaza, hamburguesas de búfalo, perros rez y pasteles de carne, empanadillas y pastel de calabaza y manzana. ¡Los bocadillos eran bastante sabrosos y asequibles y todos parecían ansiosos por probar! Vimos cantantes, bailarines y bateristas y escuchamos actuaciones musicales tradicionales y contemporáneas. Se formaron círculos de tambores y muchos de los asistentes se unieron. Los artesanos indios estaban vendiendo artesanías, hermosas mantas, tejidos, cestas, joyas, etc. ¡El aire era bastante agradable y agradable, y todos tuvieron un viaje divertido y seguro! Gracias Cottage City Commission, por autorizar un maravilloso día de "edutainment". ¡Esperamos emprendimientos futuros similares que involucren a los "Primeros Pueblos" de nuestra nación

Nota: Durante la charla en autobús, el Sr. Proctor hizo un "Show & Tell" en el que repartió varios artefactos tradicionales de la India para un escrutinio más detallado, como cuentas, puntas de flecha y piedra de osidia negra, cascabeles de venado y una pequeña piel de piel de castor. También tocaba una flauta nativa americana hecha de madera de cedro rojo adornada con una cabeza de águila tallada. El sonido era inquietante y fascinante, al mismo tiempo que suave.

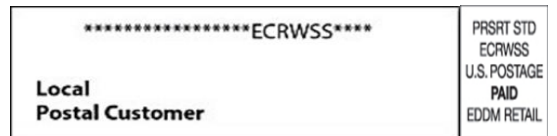
